

# SIKKIM NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY

## EXAMINATION REGULATION

The End-Semester Results for Academic Session 2025/26 for the examination held in February -March 2026 has been released. Students are directed to collect their respective grade sheets (online) from the office on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2026, 11 PM onwards. Students are directed to go through the following directions before collecting their grade sheets.

**Some of the rules and regulations hereinafter after have been reframed to keep all rules in line with other NLU examination regulations. These rules are subject to the final approval of the EC.**

### Re-Evaluation of Answer Scripts

1. Re-evaluation of answers scripts will be allowed only in the case of theory papers. A student cannot apply for revaluation of more than 3 papers in a semester.
2. Students can apply for revaluation of papers within ten days of the declaration of the results after paying the requisite fees under the following categories PPR (post publication review) and PPS. (Post publication scrutiny). Under PPR, the paper will be reviewed in its entirety and under PPS the paper will be examined only for deciding arithmetic errors.
3. Students can apply for either PPR or PPS after paying the requisite fees. For PPR the fees is Rs 500 per paper and for PPS the fee is Rs 300 per paper.
4. Selection of the papers in which one wishes to seek re-evaluation has to be done carefully. No second application for additional papers shall be accepted.
5. When a student applies for re-evaluation, s/he has to surrender her/his original performance and accept the revised performance in which:
  - a. there may be no change of marks, or
  - b. there can be increase in marks
6. If the award of the Re-evaluation for PPR varies from the original award up to and including +5% of the maximum marks, the original award will stand as it is.
7. Please note the University will not accept any application for review unless the same is brought through the review process as mentioned in point 1 above.

For failed and debarred students, please note the following rules which are subject to approval by the EC

### **PROMOTION TO HIGHER SEMESTER/S**

1. A candidate shall be promoted to the Third Semester only if s/he clears 80% (Eighty percent) i.e. 11 the papers of the First Semester and Second Semester.
2. A candidate shall be promoted to the Fifth Semester provided s/he clears all the papers of the First and Second Semester and 80% i.e. 10 papers of the Third and Fourth Semester.
3. A candidate shall be promoted to the Seventh Semester provided s/he clears all the papers of the first four semesters and 80% i.e. 10 papers of the of the Fifth and Sixth Semesters.
4. A candidate shall be promoted to the Ninth Semester provided s/he clears all the papers of the First Six Semesters and 80% i.e. 10 papers of the Seventh and Eighth Semesters.

### **REPEAT AND REAPPEAR EXAMINATION**

1. The university shall conduct a repeat or reappear examination after every semester for the following category of students.
  - a. A student who has missed a regular end semester examination due to participation in a University-approved moot court competition and other co-curricular event held during the end semester examination. The student must obtain a prior exemption from the end-semester examination by applying to the UC.
  - b. A student who was unable to write the end semester examination due to hospitalization or a contagious disease or a serious psychological condition.

c. A student who participated in a Foreign Exchange Programme under Part X and allowed to write a repeat exam under Regulation

d. A student whose examination has been cancelled due to violation of examination regulations during the previous academic year.

e. A student debarred from the end-semester examination of any subject for reasons of shortage of attendance in the previous academic year.

Explanation I: A student who has been debarred from appearing in end-semester examination due to shortage of attendance will not be eligible to appear for repeat examination in that academic year.

Explanation II: Marks obtained in a repeat examination written under points (d) and (e) of this Regulation shall not be considered for the purpose of any medal, prize or honour to be awarded on the basis of grades obtained in any subject.

In reference to point d and e please see the following Illustration -

In an academic session of 12 course, a student is debarred from writing the examination in four courses for shortage of attendance. The student

1. will not be eligible to appear for repeat examination in that academic year.
2. If the student fails to qualify in 80 percent of the total course (either for reasons of shortage of attendance or failing to secure the minimum qualifying grade), shall be deemed unsuccessful and shall be admitted to the same class in the next academic year and shall study the subjects which she/he could not pass and get evaluated afresh, following all the requirements of a regular student.
